Do You Still Need Your Spotted Lanternfly Permit?

The spotted lanternfly is an invasive insect that can be damaging to Pennsylvania agriculture. To stop the spread, the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture has issued a quarantine for counties where this pest has been confirmed. Businesses operating in the quarantine zone and moving equipment and goods within and out of the zone are required to have a permit.

May 1, 2019


ONLINE COURSE Pennsylvania Certified Crop Adviser Study Guide
