Right to Know Requests that are filed electronically will be answered in the normal timeframe unless otherwise updated by Council.

The **March Council Work Session is cancelled** and the scheduled agenda items (Powell Property Presentation) will be rescheduled for another time.

The **Borough Community Park is open**. We ask that you use your best judgment and practice safe social distancing.

The Proclamation authorizes the Emergency Management Coordinator and Council President to use available resources and personnel to assist in addressing any consequences that may arise due to this emergency.
