

MINUTES OF THE EIGHTEENTH MONTHLY MEETING  
OF THE BOROUGH OF CHESTER HEIGHTS, PA.  
COUNCIL  
HELD IN THE SCHOOL BUILDING, MONDAY  
JUNE 2, 1947 at 8 P. M.

This eighteenth meeting was called to order by the President of Council, J. Taney Willcox. Councilmen Stromgren and Krebs absent.

The minutes of the May meeting were read by the Secretary and unanimously approved with the proviso the following Resolution be made, "That Borough Council does not agree with the action of the Board of Adjustments in the appeal of C?Nelson Smitheman on the question of the change of his property zones. It being maintained that in the event of sale, of any of this property now in Zone A, for building purposes, the purchaser must appeal to the Board of Adjustments for the right to build on any plot of ground less than the 3 acres as provided for in Zone A. and if the Board of Adjustments grant such exceptions after advertising for a public hearing, duly advertised for two successive weeks, then any such purchaser of property in Zone A would be privileged to build."

Bills presented to Council by the "Rockdale Herald" for advertising were unanimously approved. The Bill of Mr. Houtman, Borough Engineer was directed to be turned over to Mr. Little for further ~~xx~~ consultation with Mr. Houtman re. the apparent incomplete sketch of Borough Roads where signs are to be placed designating Borough limits.

The next order of business was the report of the Treasurer, Mr. Josephine G. Brenneman. This report was made in careful detail, even to the recitation of such fixed expenditures as salaries of Borough Officers and employees, the monthly bill for Street Lighting according to a yearly contract etc. etc. The Treasurers report was unanimously approved as submitted.

The committee appointed to further investigate the possibilities of Trash collection reported progress

It was moved, seconded and unanimously RESOLVED, the bid for Trash Collection submitted by Samuel Shank, Chester Heights, Pa. be REJECTED and his Money Order for \$50.00 which accompanied his bid be returned to him

Council requested the Secretary together with the Burgess make a report at the July meeting of the number of homes within the Borough limits

Mr. Townsend, Building Inspector reported on building activities during the past month and the apparent violation of the Building Ordinance by Mr. Hennessey of Wawa. Council directed Mr. Townsend to enforce this Ordinance if necessary. The Building Inspector was further directed to ascertain the Cubic Content of all Buildings used for non-conforming business.

It was moved, seconded and unanimously RESOLVED the Building Inspector be authorized to issue Plumbing Permits and order appropriate books and cards for this purpose.

In the report of Burgess, Walter E. Schrader, he stated numerous traffic violations are being observed on the part of local residents, particularly stop sign violations.

Council directed the Burgess to have the Police Dep't. enforce the laws in this respect for the safety of all concerned and to report result at the July meeting.

Mr. Donald Hamilton read a petition for another Taxi Cab service thru Chester Heights. Hearing to take place Tuesday June 3rd. 1947 at the Court House in Media, Pa. The petitioner is the Yellow Cab Co. of Delaware County.

Mr. De Shong of the Phila. Elec. Co. addressed Council and offered objections to some of the terms of Ordinance No. 11. Upon concluding his objections Mr. Willcox requested he submit his objections in writing so that Council could study these objections and take appropriate action.

Mr. DeShong said he would prepare his companies objections in writing and forward them to the Borough Secretary.

Ther being no further business it was moved, seconded and unanimously RESOLVED this meeting adjourn.
