

MINUTES OF THE TWENTY SECOND MONTHLY MEETING
OF THE BOROUGH OF CHESTER HEIGHTS COUNCIL
HELD IN THE BOROUGH SCHOOL BUILDING, MONDAY
OCTOBER 6th. 1947

Meeting called to order by the Secretary, C. Nelson Smitheman at 8:10 P.M. due to the absence of the President, J. Taney Willcox.

Mr. E. Clay Krebs name was placed in nomination, seconded and a motion made further nomination be closed for the vacancy of temporary chairman.

Mr. Krebs was unanimously seated as the acting chairman. All other Councilmen were present with the exception of Mr. Loehr A. Kerns.

The first order of business was the reading of the minutes of the September 8th. meeting, which minutes were unanimously approved as read.

A bill for \$1.75 was submitted by the Secretary from T.F. Chrostwaite, Esq. for one copy of the 1947-1949 supplement to the Penna. Borough Law which was unanimously approved for payment.

Checks were received from the Tax Collector and the Justice of the Peace, also a written report from Constable John S. Voigt.

Mrs. Josephine G. Breneman read her Treasurers Report which was unanimously accepted.

Mr. Irwin A. Littel, Chairman of the Highway Committee reported needed repairs to Matson Road had been authorized in the amount of \$498.60 and that the "Speed Signs" for the Borough had been shipped Sep't. 25, 1947 but had not as yet arrived, however, the way bill had been received in the amount of \$94.45.

Proposed Ord. 14 (Transient Business Ordinance) which was due to be reported upon by the Committee appointed by President Willcox at the September meeting was again set aside until the November

meeting due to such a request which came thru Councilman Breneman from Councilman Kerns.

Mr. Keller moved this report be postponed until the November meeting of Council, the motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

The letter from John H. Ware 3rd. representing the Octoraro Branch Citizens Group which first came up at the September meeting was further discussed at great length due to reports made of a meeting w week ago. As a result of the reports of this meeting the Chester Heights Borough Council decided to table this matter and have their own Council carry on as formerly provided for.

It was moved, seconded and unanimously RESOLVED One hundred dollars (\$100.00) be transferred from the Un-appropriated Balance account in the Budget to the "Office Expense Fund"

Mr. Townsend, Bldg. Inspector asked advise of Council concerning the issuing of a requested permit to construct Ceptic tank sewage disposal unit on the property of Mr. Hennesy at Wawa.

It was discovered this question was answered in the Plumbing and Building Code which the Building Inspector can use as a guide.

Before adjourning the Secretary, in an effort to protect himself in the event of the distruction of Borough Records and other valuable papers by fire, drew attention to the fact that the Fire-proof Safe File ordered upon the authorization of Council at April 7th. meeting had arrived and all 650 lbs. of it, inside a crate, was deposited by five men in the kitchen of the Secretary; unfortunately with the front against the wall. The Secretary, as a consequence, is unable to make use of this Safe File until such time as the Necessary work is done upon the Borough Office and the Safe File placed therein in such a manner as to make it usable. Let us first hope there will be no fire and secondly this piece of office equipment will find its proper home shortly.

There being no further business a motion to adjourn was made, seconded and unanimously carried.
