

MINUTES OF THE TWENTY-THIRD MONTHLY MEETING
 OF THE BOROUGH OF CHESTER HEIGHTS, PA. COUNCIL
 HELD IN THE BROUGH SCHOOL BUILDING, MONDAY
 NOVEMBER 3rd. 1947 - - 8 P.M.

This meeting was called to order at 8 P.M. with all Councilmen present except Mr. Stromgren.

The minutes of the October meeting were read by the Secretary and were unanimously approved as read.

Bills due for payment were presented for Councils consideration and the following were unanimously approved for payment.

President of Council next requested a report from various administrative departments and committees.

Chief Burgess, Walter E. Schrader reported that during the proceeding 30 days to this meeting the 35 M.P.H. Speed Signs and Posts had arrived and with the help of a few volunteers they had all been erected and also has been put into effect with the result there had been one arrest made for violation of the newly created speed limit zone.

Mrs. Josephine Breneman, Treasurer submitted her usual monthly report which was unanimously accepted as read.

Samuel E. Jobson, Tax Collector turned over to the Secretary another installment of Taxes collected and stated there remained only six delinquent accounts in the entire Borough.

Chairman Irwin K, Little of the Highway Committee announced repairs to Mattson Road had been satisfactorilly completed by the Contractor and that this stretch of Borough Road was now in shape to withstand the rigors of winter weather.

Councilman H. Herbert Breneman, reported upon the questionnaire sent to each voter and tax payer, stating there had been a return so far of about 1/3 which would be considered a good return by other survey standards, however, he believed more questionnaires could be gotten in thru the medium of the "Borough News". Mr. Breneman reported several people had noted the fact they were not getting the "Borough News" which was accounted for by these people not being frequent visitors to the two-points of distribution. Councilman Breneman offered the following Resolution which was approved.

RESOLVED, that the "Borough News" be prepared and mailed, at Borough expense, to each resident in the Community for the balance of the year, 1947. There was one negative vote to this Resolution, that of E. Clay Krebs.

The Secretary was requested to write the Public Utilities operating in and thru the Borough of Chester Heights in regard to their payment of fees for Poles, Wires, Conduits etc.

Councilman Lohr E. Kerns reporting upon the prolonged study of the proposed ordinance governing "Transient Business" stated his Committee was in unanimous accord that no such proposed ordinance be enacted.

It was moved, seconded and unanimously RESOLVED that the report of Councilman Kerns Committee upon the proposed Transient Business ordinance be accepted that this matter be referred to the Burgess and the Borough Solicitor for a report from them at the Dec. meeting.

Constable S. Voigt upon submitting his monthly Police Report stated if the Borough was notified whenever breaks occurred at Broad Meadows Farm and at Glen Mills Training School considerable help could be rendered these institutions promptly due to the fact a great many escaping prisoners make their way to this neighborhood and might be picked up before perpetrating further crimes and escaping.

Councilman Breneman drew the attention of Council to the fact he had discovered a few important in-accuracies in the printing of Ordinance No. 6 and 11 and suggested all copies of these two ordinances be destroyed and that new and correct copies be printed and that in the future proofs of ordinances be submitted by the printer before publication or printing. Council unan~~im~~ously agreed this should be done.

There being no further business to come before Council a motion to adjourn was made and unanimously passed.
