

MINUTES OF THE 36th. MONTHLY MEETING
OF THE BOROUGH OF CHESTER HEIGHTS, PA. COUNCIL
HELD IN THE BOROUGH SCHOOL BLDG. MONDAY
DECEMBER 6th. 1948 at 8 P.M.

With all Councilmen present, Mr. Willcox, Pres. called this meeting to order at 8 P.M.

The minutes of the November 1st. meeting were read and unanimously approved.

The following bills were presented for approval and received Councils unanimous approval.

Mrs. Josephine G. Breneman read her Treasurers report which was unanimously approved.

Burgess, Walter E. Schrader submitted a written report dealing with the Police Dept. which was unanimously approved and Council commended the Burgess upon the clarity and comprehensive nature of this report. Council directed this report be placed in the Borough Files.

Mr. Pyle, Pres. of the Chester Heights Fire Co. was welcomed by President Willcox and invited to speak. Mr. Pyle invited the members of Council to inspect the new Fire Equipment which was parked outside the School Bldg. and urged Council to attend Fire Co. meetings.

Constable Chas. McCann read his monthly report which was marked for File.

Chief of Police John Voigt read his report for the month of November which was then turned over to the Secy. for file.

Councilman Breneman complimented Chief of Police Voigt upon the completeness of his report.

Burgess Schrader lauded the work of the Fire Co. and the

local police at the Davis Fire earlier in the month.

Mr. Breneman read on behalf of the special Police Committee appointed by Pres. of Council, J. Taney Willcox, the first part of this Committees report which dealt with local and State police activity within a Borough such as Chester Heights.

Mr. Keller read part (2) of the special Police report which has to do with various possible Police methods in our borough as well as an estimate of there respective cost.

Both Part No. 1 and No. 2 were laid upon the Secretarys desk for file.

It was moved, seconded and unanimously RESOLVED the Special Police Committee Report be not acted upon at this time but that action be delayed pending further investigation and developments.

Council requested J. of P. Buckley give a monthly itimized report of fines received accompanied by a listing of the source of each fine whether thru an arrest by local police or by State Police.

Mr. Donald Hamilton, Esq. offered his compliments to Councilmen Brenemen and Keller upon their excellent report of the special Police Committee. The compliments voiced by Mr. Hamilton were echoed by all members of Council, excluding Councilmen Brenemen and Keller.

Mr. Brenemen offered the thought that Council consider, beginning at this time, the future establishment of a fitting Borough Building to meet the needs existing at present and pressing in the future.

The following motion was made, seconded and unanimously RESOLVED

RESOLUTION

Upon motion it was unanimously

RESOLVED the THE BOROUGH OF CHESTER HEIGHTS accept from THE TOWNSHIP OF ASTON the sum of ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$100.00) in addition to the sum of FIFTY-NINE DOLLARS AND SEVENTY-NINE CENTS (\$59.79) now owing for delinquent taxes

to be collected in full settlement of all claims for delinquent taxes against THE Township of Aston and that The Borough Solicitor be instructed to prepare the proper papers to consummate the settlement.

Mr. Breneman brought up and advocated the revival of the "Trash Collection question.

Mr. Mark Willcox who was present at this meeting voiced his pleasure and approval, as a tax paying resident, of the reports, opinions and procedure he had observed during this meeting.

In compliance with a request of the Dep't. of Highways in relation to "Stop" signs on Matson Road the following resolution was moved, seconded and unanimously passed.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The Borough Council desires to designate as a "Stop Intersection," the intersection of ~~L.R. 23026, Chester Heights Road, and Mattson Road~~-----traffic to be stopped on -----Mattson Road -----in Chaster Heights ---in the county of----Delaware---, and

WHEREAS, The approval of the Secretary of Highways is necessary as provided in the Motor Vehicle Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the intersection of--L.R.--23026 -----Chester Heights Road, and Mattson Road-----is hereby designated as a "Stop Intersection" and all traffic shall come to a full stop when proper signs are erected at said intersection, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the --Borough-----of Chester Heights does hereby request, and grant authority and approval for the erection of the necessary signs by the Department of Highways, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That said intersection shall not be considered a "Stop Intersection" unless or until the Secretary of Highways

approves this resolution and the Department of Highways erects the necessary signs to stop traffic as indicated above.
