

MINUTES OF THE 39th. MONTHLY MEETING OF
THE BOROUGH OF CHESTER HEIGHTS, PA. COUNCIL
HELD IN THE BOROUGH SCHOOL BLDG.
MONDAY, MARCH 7th. 1949 at 8 P.M.

Meeting called to order at 8 P.M.

Councilmen Keller and Kerns were absent .

The minutes of the Feb. meeting were read and unanimously approved.

Mrs. Josephine G. Breneman read her Treasurers Report which was unanimously accepted.

Mr. Walter E. Schrader, Burgess stated he had no official report to make.

Chief of Police Voigt reported several housebreakings in Chester Heights of unoccupied houses.

J. of P. Buckley reported to Council that between the hours of 10 P.M. and 8 A.M. he has no ability to commit a prisoner to jail except by arrangement with some nearby town or community having a jail and for such a commitment the Borough would be billed for the board and lodging of prisoners committed to nearby town or community jail.

Councilman Irvin K. Little as chairman of the Highway Committee presented the problem of inadequate street lighting at the junction of Route 1 (Balto.Pike) and Route 261 (Chester Heights Road)

It was agreed by several members of Council that in certain weather conditions it is most difficult to find the juncture of these roads because of the almost total absence of light.

It was moved, seconded and unanimously RESOLVED that the Highway Committee be authorized to move the present nearest light to the intersection to a point more appropriate and that a sufficiently powerful light be installed to adequately light this intersection.
