

MINUTES OF THE 40th. MONTHLY MEETING OF  
THE BOROUGH OF CHESTER HEIGHTS, PA. COUNCIL  
HELD IN THE BOROUGH SCHOOL BLDG.,  
MONDAY, APRIL 4th. 1949 at 8 P.M.

President of Council, J. Taney Willcox called this meeting to order at 8 P.M. All members of Council were present.

The minutes of the March 7th. meeting were read and un-animously approved.

The Secretary presented the following bills for payment which were unanimously approved.

Letters from the Delaware County Association of Boroughs and a would be Dog Catcher were read to Council and marked for file.

Mrs. Josephine G. Breneman read her treasurers report which was unanimously approved.

Walter E. Schrader, Burgess reported the purchase of one Police Siren which is being tried out upon the car of Officer McCann. The Burgess stated a 2nd Siren will be purchased for the car of Chief Voigt if satisfactory.

Chief of Police John D. Voigt submitted his monthly Police Report in writing which was turned over to the Special Police Committee.

Constable Chas. G. McCann submitted his monthly report in writing which also was turned over to the Special Police Committee.

James T. Townsend, Building Inspector turned in one Building Permit issued during the month of March 1949.

Irvin K. Little, Chairman of the Highway Committee reported arrangements had been made with the Philadelphia Electric Co. for the erection of a new street light at the intersection of Route No.1

and Route 261. This light is expected to be in operation by the end of April.

J. of P. Buckley had no report other than his usual statement of ~~xx~~ violations during the month of March and a notice of the Delaware County Magistrates Associations Annual Dinner to be held May 17th.

The Special Police Committee reported progress. They are continuing to gather the monthly Police Reports which are being analyzed toward the end of making comprehensive police recommendations.

Councilman H. Herbert Breneman in speaking about the Boy Scout Camp site within the Borough limits stated that he felt official permission should have been sought in establishing this camp. After much discussion Councilman Breneman moved the Borough Ordinance be enforced in relation to this camp. While Council did not second this motion it was agreed this matter should be referred to the Burgess and the Building Inspector for investigation.

President J. Taney Willcox proposed that the upkeep of the War Memorial on the School Grounds be paid for by the Borough. It was consequently mov@d seconded and unanimously RESOLVED the cost of maintaining the present WAR Memorial, shrubbery and lawn in presentable appearance, be paid out of Borough funds.

There being no further business it was moved seconded and unanimously resolved this meeting adjourn.
