

MINUTES OF THE 41st. MONTHLY MEETING OF
THE BOROUGH OF CHESTER HEIGHTS, PA. COUNCIL
HELD IN THE BOROUGH SCHOOL BUILDING
MONDAY, MAY 2nd. 1949 at 8 P.M.

President of Council, J. Taney Willcox called this meeting to order at 8 P.M. the absent members of Council were Mr. Kerns and Mr. Strongren.

The minutes of April meeting were read by the Secretary and unanimously approved.

A letter of resignation from Mark Willcox, Jr. as a Borough Auditor was read to Council by the Secretary.

It was moved, seconded and unanimously resolved to table this resignation for the present.

Mrs. Josephine G. Breneman read her Treasurers Report which was unanimously approved.

Mr. Walter E. Schrader, Burgess reported having contacted the Penna. Dep't. of Highways regarding some means or other of promoting greater safety for cars turning at the intersection of U.S. Route 1 and Pa. Route 261.

It was moved seconded and unanimously Resolved the Burgess make a formal request from the Penna. Dep't. of Highways to make a survey of the intersection of U.S. 1 and Pa. 261 and to provide the Burgess with its recommendations.

Chief of Police, John Voigt submitted his monthly Police Report in writing which, as usual, was turned over to the Special Police Committee for study.

Chief Voigt also stated he was trying to find someone to take care of the Borough War Memorial.

Constable McCann made his usual Police Report in writing which was also turned over to the Special Police Committee.

Donald H. Hamilton, Solicitor reported inspecting the Boy Scout Camp located within the Borough and found this camp to be, in every way, well organized and well cared for. He stated he had been informed this Camp ground had been in use as such for the past 20 years, therefore is non-conforming as far as our Zoning Ordinance is concerned. It is Mr. Hamilton's opinion that unless some violation of the Zoning Ord. is perpetrated, there is little or nothing the Borough Police can do about this situation. Mr. Hamilton stated he did not consider the situation as it exists at present to be objectionable.

Councilman, Herbert H. Breneman stated the Boy Scout Troop or troops using this ground are inmates of the Flynn Training School and that

people living in the neighborhood of this camp are afraid for the safety of their children, particularly the girls.

There being no further business to come before Council at this meeting it was moved seconded and unanimously resolved to adjourn.
