

MINUTES OF THE 43rd. MONTHLY MEETING OF  
 THE BOROUGH OF CHESTER HEIGHTS, PA. COUNCIL  
 HELD IN THE BOROUGH SCHOOL BLDG.  
 MONDAY, JULY 11th. 1949 at 8 P.M.

Councilmen Kerns and Krebs were absent when President, J. Taney Willcox called this meeting to order.

The minutes of the June 6th. meeting were read by the Secretary and unanimously approved.

The following bills were presented to Council for approval and were unanimously approved for payment.

President Willcox next called upon the Treasurer, Mrs. Josephine G. Breneman for her monthly report which was read and un-animously approved.

Burgess, Walter E. Schrader upon submitting his report stated the only application he had received for the Police vacancy was that of the former Police Officer, Chas. G. McCann, resigned.

Upon Council being advised the Bell Tel. Co. had ignored all billing for two years taxes upon their Poles and Conduits, it was moved, seconded and unanimously approved that the Solicitor, Donald H. Hamilton take appropriate action against the Bell Tel. Co. in order to collect these delinquent taxes.

Councilman, Edwin H. Keller upon reporting on behalf of the Special Police Committee stated after a careful study of this subject the Committee feel the present police set up or system should be continue. Mr. Keller also stated the Committee were favorable to the re-instatement of Chas. G. McCann and would urge that he reconsider his resignation,

It was moved, seconded and unanimously voted <sup>by</sup>/Council that Chas. G. McCann be re-instated as a Police Officer effective this 11th day of July 1949 and to serve until the first Monday of Jan. 1950.

Chief of Police filed his usual police report for the month of June after verbally explaining the report to Council. The report was unanimously approved.

The Highway Committee has no report to make other than progress particularly upon the subject of the proposed widening of Route No. 1 in the vicinity of the intersection of Route 261.

It was moved, seconded and unanimously approved that the Secretary issue an order for the payment of the \$300.00 contribution to the Chester Heights Fire Co. No. 1 as provided in the Budget.

Councilman Breneman protested the issuance of a permit on the property of Elmer Fritz for the purpose of erecting temporary Boy Scout Bldg's. as a violation of both the Building Code and Zoning Ord. This subject was referred to Committee for a comprehensive study of both Ordinances , with instructions that the Committee report their findings to Council.

It was moved, seconded and unanimously agreed that the Secretary write the Superintendent of The Elwyn Training School bringing to his attention the fact that both the Building Code and the Zoning Ordinance had been violated, Council further directed the Secretary send a copy of his letter to Burgess, Walter Schrader and to Building Inspector, James T. Townsend.

There being no further business it was moved, seconded and unanimously agreed to adjourn despite the absence of Councilman Krebs.
