

MINUTES OF THE 44th. MONTHLY MEETING OF
THE BOROUGH OF CHESTER HEIGHTS, PA. COUNCIL
HELD IN THE BOROUGH SCHOOL BLDG.
MONDAY, August 1st. 1949 at 8 P.M.

President Willcox called this meeting to order at 8 P.M.
Councilmen Keller & Stromgren were absent.

The Secretary read the minutes of the previous meeting which were approved as read.

It was moved, seconded and unanimously Resolved the following bills be paid.

The President called upon the Treasurer, Mrs. Josephine G. Breneman for her usual monthly report which was unanimously approved as read.

Burgess Schrader reminded Council that the School Board had not yet received their check for the use of the School Bldg. for Council meetings and suggested that this item be paid. He also stated that Officer McCann while performing his Police duties with his own car in pursuing a Motor Vehicle Violater had damaged the rear of his own car and he, the Burgess was therefore recommending financial help from Council in compensating Officer McCann for the damage done. The Burgess also complained about the use of Fire Works in the neighborhood of the school earlier tonight and stated he had warned the culprits a warrent would be issued for the next offense of this nature.

President Willcox referred the question of damage to Officer McCanns car to the Police Committee.

The Highway Committee had no specific report to make at this time, however, the Secretary stated that he had been informed a few days ago by Wm. S. Canning, Engineering Director of the Keystone Automobile

Club that he had learned from Mr. Stackpole of Penna. Dept. of Highways that the proposed widening of the Baltimore Pike at the intersection of Route 261 to a four lane width had been definitely approved but that it was not certain if the Department would be able to get this work done before winter.

The Police Committee had no formal report to make at this meeting.

There being no further Committee reports to be made the next order

of business was a motion which was seconded and unanimously passed to pay

the Chester Heights School District the \$150.00 for the use of the School

Bldg. by Council.

Mr. Breneman in substituting for Chairman, Edw. E. Keller of the

Zoning Committee recommended that certain changes be made in the Zoning

Ordinance and that weaknesses in the issuing of Permits by the Building

Inspector be corrected.

President Willcox referred this matter of proposed corrections back

to the Zoning Committee for their recommendation of proposed change.

It was moved, seconded and unanimously Resolved that Mr. Samuel

E. Jobson be exonerated for the collection of 1948 Taxes in so far as all

Taxes had either been collected or that County authorities notified of

delinquents and that the Bond of Mr. Jobson for this purpose be released.

Mr. Buckley again complained of the alleged unsafe condition of

the bridge near his property and wished to have his complaint made a matter

of record.

There being no further business it was moved, seconded and unanimously

resolved to adjourn.
