

MINUTES OF THE 46th. MONTHLY MEETING OF
THE BOROUGH OF CHESTER HEIGHTS, PA. COUNCIL
HELD IN THE BOROUGH SCHOOL BLDG.
MONDAY OCT. 3rd. 1949 at 8 P.M.

Meeting called to order by President of Council J. Taney
Willcox at 8 P.M. Councilmen Kerns and Strongren were absent.

The minutes of the Sep't. meeting were read by the Secretary
and unanimously approved.

The following bills were presented for payment and unanim-
ously approved.

The Treasurer, Mrs. Josephine G. Erceman was called upon
for her monthly report which she read. The report was unanimously
approved.

Burgess, Walter Schrader had no official report to make at
this meeting.

Chief of Police Voigt submitted his usual monthly Police
Report which was turned over to the Police Committee.

Building Inspector, Mr. James Townsend had no report to
submit.

Highway Commissioner, Irwin K. Little likewise had no report
for this meeting.

Edwin H. Keller, Chairman of the Special Police Committee
reported that the majority of the members of this Committee were agains
paying Constable Chas. McCann for repairs to his car, holding that
the 10¢ per mile presently paid should be sufficient to take care of
such emergencies.

The minority held that 10¢ per mile would be adequate except
if repairs exceed \$25.00 per year. After due consideration of this
question it was Moved, seconded and unanimously Resolved that Council

accept the majority report of the Special Police Committee and that the majority report be accepted to govern this and like questions.

Mr. Edwin H. Keller offered the following resolution which was seconded and unanimously approved.

Resolved that the Building Inspector be instructed to not issue Building Permits without the approval of Council, unless he is satisfied that all provisions of applicable ordinances are observed.

There being no further business it was moved, seconded and unanimously resolved to adjourn.
