

MINUTES OF THE 52nd. MONTHLY MEETING OF
THE BOROUGH OF CHESTER HEIGHTS, PA. COUNCIL
HELD IN THE BOROUGH SCHOOL BUILDING
MONDAY, APRIL 3, 1950 at 8 P.M.

Meeting called to order at 8 P.M. by President of Council,
J. Taney Willcox. All members of Council present except Mr. Lohr Kerns

The minutes of the previous meeting were read by the Secretary
and unanimously approved.

A motion was made, seconded and unanimously passed to authorize
the payment of the following bills.

A notice from Morris M. Sapovits, Secretary, Redevelopment
Authority of the County of Delaware was brought to the attention of
Council who directed this notice be acknowledged and that fact be
recorded in the minutes of this meeting.

Mrs. Josephine G. Breneman read the Treasurers Report which
was unanimously approved.

The Building Inspector, James T. Townsend filed 3 Permits with
an accompanying check to cover the necessary Permit Fees.

Burgess Schrader relayed to Council complaints he had received
from residents of the Borough about the further curtailment of milk
delivery on Sunday.

Council felt this was a matter which could only be worked out
on the basis of supply and demand between the Producer, the Drivers
Union and the individual consumer.

Burgess Schrader reported the offer by the Delaware County
Tuberculosis & Health Asso. in cooperation with the Delaware County
Medical Society of an opportunity on Tuesday, May 9th. 1950 between
the hours of 1:30 and 4:30 in the afternoon and between 6 and 8 in

the evening for residents over 18 years of age to receive a Chest X Ray at the new school at Concordville, Pa. There are no cost for these X-Rays.

Mr. Schrader also relayed information to Council of a further curtailment of passenger train service to Wawa is rumored to become effective with the next Daylight Saving change of timetables.

It was moved, seconded and unanimously passed that the Borough Solicitor, Donald H. Hamilton write Mr. F.M. Ware, Gen'l. Passanger Agent 30th. st. Station, Phila. Pa. inquiring about this rumor and to protest any further cut in train service to Wawa, Pa.

Mr. Theo. O. Buckley, J. of P. requested permission to put a question before Council which request was granted. Mr. Buckley inquired why only one Plumbers license was issued during the year 1949 whereas he alleged more than one plumber worked in the Borough during 1949.

Council requested the Secretary ask the Building Inspector for a report upon this question.

There being no further business it was moved, seconded and unanimously RESOLVED to adjourn.
