

MINUTES OF THE 55th. MONTHLY MEETING OF  
THE BOROUGH OF CHESTER HEIGHTS, PA. COUNCIL  
HELD IN THE BOROUGH SCHOOL BUILDING  
MONDAY JULY 10th. AT 8 P.M.

President J. Taney Willcox call to order was a welcome sound following his recent illness.

The minutes of the June meeting were read by the Secretary and unanimously approved.

The Secretary presented the following bills for approval of Council.

Above bills were unanimously approved for payment and the Secretary thereby authorized to issue the necessary Warrants upon the Treasurer.

Income and correspondence were next reported to Council and properly disposed of.

The Treasurer, Mrs. Josephine G. Breneman read her report which was unanimously approved. The report of the treasurer included the receipt of a check from the Auditor General's Office in Harrisburg for \$226.88 to be turned over to the Chester Heights <sup>Vol. RELIEF ASSO</sup> ~~Fire Co. No. 1~~ by indorsement (see letter from Auditor General) (This amount of \$226.88 was not deposited into the General Funds of the Borough. It was moved and seconded and unanimously resolved the Treasurer transfer this check for \$226.88 to the Fire Co.

The Burgess reported he had learned the Chester Municipal Authority would install within the borough on or near Matson Road an 8" tap in their pipe line upon request of the Borough, the cost of such a tap to the Water Authority is alleged to be \$308.00 therefore only installed if the Borough feels such a tap would be of present or

future use. Burgess Schrader further stated the water coming out of the pipe line within the Borough would be gravity fed which would probably necessitate a booster pump and water meter. The Burgess <sup>CORRECTION</sup> had no recommendation ~~ED~~ *COUNCIL TAKE STEPS NECESSARY TO OBTAIN AT LEAST TWO OUTLETS FROM THIS LINE FOR BOROUGH USE. NO ACTION WAS TAKEN ON THIS RECOMMENDATION* whatever at this time.

Chief of Police, John S. Voigt submitted his usual monthly report in writing as did Constable Chas. McCann.

The Building Inspector turned in a Building Permit issued in the month of June.

The Highway Committee and the Special Police Committee had no special report to make at this meeting.

As to unfinished business; Alternates to sign checks for the Secretary Treasurer and President in emergencies, it was agreed by Council the Secretary and Treasurer submit at the August meeting the names of alternates for this specific purpose. Such alternates to be designated as Assistant Secretary and Assistant Treasurer. The presently elected Vice President of Council could be qualified to sign check in emergencies for the President.

Councilman Edwin Keller offered a suggestion of providing street signs for Borough Roads as a means of identifying various locations within the Borough. This was referred to the Highway Committee for study and report.

Borough Solicitor, Donald H. Hamilton was unable to get in writing a letter from the Delaware County Trust Co. concerning the 1949 Delinquent taxes of the Aston Realty Co. but was informed these taxes would be paid, however, Council directed Mr. Hamilton consult with the Borough School Board in relation to going with the Borough in obtaining a lein against the Aston Realty Co. for their delinquent taxes.

There being no further business it was unanimously moved and seconded to adjourn.
