

MINUTES OF THE 57th. MONTHLY MEETING OF  
 THE BOROUGH OF CHESTER HEIGHTS, PA. COUNCIL  
 HELD IN THE BOROUGH SCHOOL BUILDING  
 MONDAY, OCTOBER 2, 1950 AT  
 8:00 o'CLOCK P.M.

The Meeting was called to order by the President, Mr. Willcox, at 8:00 o'clock P.M. In the absence of the Secretary, who was ill, DONALD H. HAMILTON, ESQUIRE, Borough Solicitor, was appointed Secretary of the Meeting Pro Tem.

All members of Council were present, with the exception of Mr. Breneman. The Secretary read the Minutes of the last meeting held September 11th. 1950, which were unanimously approved.

The Treasurer's Report was read and unanimously approved.

The Burgess reported that the Assault and Battery case discussed at the meeting of September 11th. 1950 was in process of satisfactory adjustment.

The Burgess reported that his recommendation was that CHARLES G. MCCANN be reinstated as Borough Police Officer as of October 2, 1950. It was moved by Mr. Keller and Seconded by Mr. Kerns that Charles G. McCann be reinstated as a Policeman of the Borough

of Chester Heights as of October 2, 1950, upon the same terms as his previous employment. The Burgess recommended full cooperation with the Fire Company, especially in view of the requirements of the Civil Defense Program and the duties of a Fire Company in connection therewith.

The President of Council called upon reports from Committees and none had any to submit.

The Burgess reported that it was not certain where the Water Line of the Chester Municipal Authority would be laid in the Borough. After discussion, the Burgess was authorized to defer advising the Authority to make application for a Permit until such time as the location of the proposed water line in the Borough was determined.

The Solicitor reported that he had written to Reverend Charles Truas, President of the Philadelphia Camp Meeting and Excursion Association relative to the exemption of the Camp Meeting Property from taxation and had not received a reply.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.
