

MINUTES OF THE 58th. MEETING OF
 THE BOROUGH OF CHESTER HEIGHTS, PA. COUNCIL
 HELD IN THE BOROUGH SCHOOL BUILDING
 MONDAY, NOVEMBER 6th. 1950 at
 8:00 O'CLOCK P.M.

Mr. J. Taney Willcox, Pres. of Council opened this meeting at 8 P.M. Councilman Keller, Kerns and Stromgren were absent.

The Secretary, Mr. C.N. Smitheman read the minutes of the October meeting which were unanimously approved.

Receipts were reported from Samuel E. Jobson, Tax Collector in the amount of \$530.70 and a \$10.00 fine received from J. of the P. Thos. E. Wheat of Ward, Pa.

The following bills were presented and unanimously approved for payment.

The Treasurer, Mrs. Josephine G. Breneman read her usual monthly report which was unanimously approved.

A letter from The Delaware County Board of Health Association was read to Council who directed the Secretary to inform this Association that on May 5th. 1947 this matter was turned over to the Pennsylvania Dep't. of Health.

Another letter from the Public Health Nursing Service soliciting the establishment of a budget item in the 1951 budget was directed to be turned over to the Finance Committee.

Burgess, Walter E. Schrader reported upon the Halloween celebration within the Borough as lasting about a week and involving a number of non-residents as well as local children. Considerable damage was done to property and the safety of Highway users was jeopardized. The report was a rather serious inditement against the so called pranksters with the result Council felt obliged to go on

record condemning such behavior, with the result they unanimously passed the following resolution.

RESOLVED THAT BOROUGH COUNCIL THOROUGHLY CONDEMN THE ACTION OF CERTAIN residents of the Borough, in conjunction with non-residents, in acts of vandalism and deliberate destruction of property in the Borough.

Borough Council desires to inform those responsible that if such conduct occurs in the future, they will be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law.

An additional motion was made and seconded and unanimously approved that a panel be formed consisting of the Burgess, Chief of Police, and Justice of the Peace to work in cooperation with the Juvenile Court of Delaware County and to request the cooperation of the School Board and local Churches and to set up such meetings as necessary to carry out the spirit of this resolution.

There being no other Committee reports to be made the Solicitor, Donald H. Hamilton presented a letter concerning the subject of Rent Control, with the result it was moved, seconded and the motion carried with one negative vote, that of Councilman Little, that Rent Control as provided under Federal Law be continued.

Mr. Hamilton also informed Council of a letter he received from the Penna. Dep't. of Public Instructions concerning the Sanitorium School at Wawa, Pa. and turned this letter over to the Secretary to be placed on file.

There being no further business it was moved, seconded and un-animously agreed to adjourn.
