

MINUTES OF THE 59th. MEETING OF
THE BOROUGH OF CHESTER HEIGHTS, PA. COUNCIL
HELD IN THE BOROUGH SCHOOL BUILDING
MONDAY, DEC. 4th. 1950 at
8:00 O'CLOCK P.M.

This meeting of Council was called to order by Mr. Willcox, President at 8 P.M. All members present except Mr. Stromgren.

The Secretary, Mr. Nelson Smitheman read the Minutes of the November 6th. meeting which were unanimously approved as read.

Receipts were reported of \$50.00 in fines from Justice of the Peace, Theo. O. Buckley and of \$47.56 as the 4th. and final installment of the Highway Aid Fund for this year of 1950.

The following bills were presented for payment and un-animously approved.

The Secretary, C. Nelson Smitheman presented to Council his Resignation effective January 1st. 1951, due to reasons of health and also the resignation of the Assistant Secretary, Mrs. Eva N. Smitheman. It was moved, seconded and unanimously resolved to accept these resignations.

Mrs. Josephine G. Breneman, Treasurer read her usual monthly report which was unanimously approved as read.

Burgess, Walter E. Schrader reported that prosecution of the Halloween episode would be dropped pending the future behavior of participants in the future.

The Burgess also complained, as a matter of record, upon the complete and utter waste of time in attending the case in the Media Courts involving an employee of the Sanatorium School wherein not one witness for the Borough was called upon to testify.

Mr. Irwin Little as Chairman of the Highway Committee presented to Council Mr. Campbell who represented a Highway Sign Mfr. Co.

Mr. Campbell displayed various types of Street signs, quoting the cost. The Highway Committee was directed by Council to complete a survey of the Borough Roads in order to determine the total number of signs necessary and finally to determine the name to be used in designating the Borough Road.

Mr. Samuel Ward, Mr. representing the Chester Heights Fire Co. complained of the treatment received by members of the Fire Co. upon answering calls for assistance during the storm of Saturday, Nov. 25th. causing flood conditions. His purpose in reporting to Council the alleged insults to members of the Fire Co. was to prepare Council for any complaints against the Fire Co. that might be presented .

Justice of the Peace, Theo. Buckley commented upon the promptness and dispatch with which the Pennsylvania Railroad Co. completed repairs to the Bridge over the R.R. tracks within the Borough. The entire job was completed within two weeks.

In order to fill the vacancy of Secretary, Councilman Breneman offered in nomination the name of Mr. Hilton Jones as Secretary, this nomination was seconded and unanimously approved by acclamation. Mr. Jones to take office the 1st. of January.

A resolution of thanks to the retiring Secretary for past services, was made by Mr. Breneman, seconded and unanimously approved. This resolution was further amplified by the President of Council, Mr. J. Taney Willcox.

It was moved, seconded and unanimously resolved that Burgess Schraders dismissal of Police Officer McCann be confirmed as of Oct. 17th. 1950.

There being no further business it was duly moved, seconded and unanimously resolved to adjourn.
