

MINUTES OF THE 62nd. MEETING OF THE
BOROUGH OF CHESTER HEIGHTS, PA. COUNCIL
HELD IN THE BOROUGH SCHOOL BUILDING
MONDAY MARCH 5th. 1951 AT
8.00 O'CLOCK P. M.

The meeting was called to order by President Willcox.

All members were present with the exception of Councilman Stromgren.

The minutes of the February meeting were unanimously approved as read. At this time Mr. David Killinger, of the Progressive Civic Association of Lenni, was presented.

Mr. Killinger stated he attended this meeting to inform Council members, and to answer any questions, concerning the proposed operation of a quarry at Lenni, to which his organization was opposed. After a lengthy discussion on the subject it was moved, seconded and approved by a vote of 3 to 2 that the following resolution be adopted, and a copy be sent to Mr. Killinger;

RESOLVED: The Council of the Borough of Chester Heights condemns the operation of any quarry near the vicinity of residential property which may be detrimental to the Borough of Chester Heights or its surroundings.

The Treasurers Report was approved as read.

Correspondence from the Solicitor of the City of Pittsburgh concerning the Bill which this City has introduced in the Legislature to rip from the Public Utility Commission its present power to place rates into effect without a hear-

ing, was read by President Willcox. After discussion it was moved, seconded and unanimously approved that the Secretary write our representatives at Harrisburg to oppose this bill.

There were no Committee Reports presented.

It was moved and seconded and unanimously approved that the property which the Chester Heights Fire Company was purchasing for the erection of a Fire House be exempted from all Borough Taxes.

The name of Mr. Claude E. Tucker, which was placed in nomination at the Feb. meeting, was withdrawn at the request of Mr. Tucker., and Mr. G. G. Schroder was nominated to fill the vacancy on the Board of Adjustments, subject to his acceptance.

Mr. Samuel E. Jobson reported uncollected taxes for the year 1950 amounted to \$ 230.54.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
