

MINUTES OF THE 59th MEETING OF THE BOROUGH
 OF CHESTER HEIGHTS PA. COUNCIL HELD IN THE BOROUGH
 SCHOOL BUILDING MONDAY JANUARY 7th 1952

This meeting was called to order by Vice-President Breneman with all members of council present.

The minutes of the December meeting were approved as read.

The Treasurers report was approved as read.

At this time Mr. H. Herbert Brenaman, Mr. Lohr E. Kerns and Mr. E. Clay Krebs presented their certificates of Election to Justice of Peace Theo. Buckley, who administered the oath of office and they took their seats as re-elected members of Council for a four year term, expiring 1956.

The next order of business was the election of officers for the term of two years.

The name of Mr. H. Herbert Breneman was placed in nomination for the office of President of Council. It was moved and seconded that nominations be closed and by unanimous consent Mr. Breneman was elected Præsident.

Nominations for Vice-President were next in order and the names of Mr. Irwin Little and Mr. Lohr E. Kerns were duly nominated. Ballots were cast by members of Council and by a majority vote Mr. Little was elected Vice-President.

Nominations for Secretary and Treasurer were next in order with the result H. E. Jones was unanimously elected Secretary and Miss Anna Dickson was unanimously elected Treasurer, for the ensuing ^{Term} year.

It was then moved, seconded and unanimously Resolved that the Bonds for the Secretary and Treasurer be renewed in their present amounts.

Upon motion, duly seconded, it was unanimously approved that the Salary of the Secretary and the Treasurer remain as before, namely; \$25.00 per month for the Secretary and for the Treasurer 2% of the amounts paid out by the Treas. upon Borough Orders or Warrants, provided that compensation shall not be paid to the Treasurer on the balance of funds turned over by the Treasurer to her successor, or on the payment of any loan on the redemption of bonds or the transfer from or to the sinking Fund, or to or from any other fund, whether upon order, warrant or otherwise.

It was unanimously agreed that all present Committees be re-appointed.

Upon motion, duly seconded and by a majority vote Section #912 of the Borough of Chester Heights Zoning Ordinance of 1946 is hereby amended in the following respects;

(a) The first paragraph thereof is changed to read as follows;

"No building, lot or premises may be used or maintained for any of the following purposes or any purpose substantially similar to any thereof.

(b) By adding at the end thereof the following;

Cement Manufacturing
Stone Crushing
Commercial boarding or breeding of dogs

Any use or activity which may be so noxious or offensive by reason of the emission of odor, dust, fumes, smoke, gas, vibration or noise as to constitute a nuisance".

Upon motion, duly seconded, it was unanimously

RESOLVED, that an account in the name of this Borough be opened or kept with the FIRST NATIONAL BANK OF MEDIA, Media, Pa., for the deposit in said Bank to the credit of this Borough from time to time of any and all moneys, checks, drafts, notes, acceptances, or other evidences of indebtedness, whether belonging to this Borough or otherwise, which may be or hereafter come into its possession, and that the said Bank be and is hereby authorized to make payment from the funds on deposit with it and according to the checks, drafts, notes or acceptances of this Borough signed by; H. Herbert Breneman, President, or Irwin K. Little, Vice President, Hilton E. Jones, Secretary, and Anna D. Dickson, Treas., including checks drawn to their own order.

Mr. Theo. Buckley presented a communication from the District Engineer of the Penna. Highway Dept. in which he expressed his regrets in being unsuccessful in his efforts to have the Penna. Railroad Company increase the load limit on the bridge in the Borough. He stated the only recourse the Borough would now have would be to file a petition with the Public Utility Commission. It was then moved, seconded and unanimously approved for the Secretary to communicate with the Public Utility Commission in an endeavor to obtain further advice on this problem.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
