

MINUTES OF THE 68th MEETING OF THE BOROUGH OF CHESTER
HEIGHTS COUNCIL HELD IN THE BOROUGH SCHOOL BUILDING
MONDAY OCTOBER 6th 1952 AT 8 P. M.

The meeting was called to order by President Breneman with all members present excepting Mr. Wood.

The minutes of the September meeting were approved.

The Treasurers report was approved as read.

Building Inspector, Mr. Jas. Townsend, reporting on his reasons for not issuing a permit for repairs and alterations to the kitchen of the Wawa Chest Hospital, stated it was his opinion that this permit should have the approval of Council. Upon motion, duly seconded, Mr. Townsend was authorized to issue the necessary permit as requested by the builder.

The Police Committee again recommended that the Borough Police Force be abolished, as the committee has been unable to arrive at a satisfactory solution of the problem with the Chief of Police. It was moved and seconded that matter be tabled until the Nov. meeting.

Upon motion, duly seconded, the Secretary was directed to send to all citizens of the Borough, a questionnaire, to be formulated by the Police Committee, relative to the Borough Police.

Director of Civil Defense John Voigt, reporting on the progress of his organization, stated he would require two additional sirens and also requested that two members of Council be appointed to serve as a committee of Civil Defense. President

Breneman appointed Mr. Joseph Townsend and Mr. Arthur Stromgren to this committee.

Chief of Police Voigt reported on police activities in the Borough and again related his difficulties with the problem of the Glen Mills escapees.

Under new business it was moved and seconded that all meetings of Borough Council from November to April inclusive commence at 7.30 P. M.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
