

MINUTES OF THE 74th MEETING OF THE BOROUGH OF CHESTER
HEIGHTS COUNCIL HELD IN THE BOROUGH SCHOOL BUILDING
MONDAY APRIL 6th 1953 AT 8.00 P. M.

With a quorum present, the meeting was called to order by
President Breneman. The absentee members were Mr. Kerns,
Mr. Little and Mr. Stromgren.

The minutes of the March meeting were approved as read.

The Treasurers report was approved as presented and
correspondence disposed of.

Burgess Schrader reported he had contacted Mr. Hollingsworth,
owner of the quarry in reference to the unsafe condition exist-
ing here. Mr. Hollingsworth would not consent to dismantling of
the machinery but stated he would fence in the property.

Mr. Schrader also reported he had received verbal assurance
from the Highway Dept. that the conduit for a future traffic
light at the intersection of Balto. Pike and Rt 261 would be
installed before the improvement is completed.

Zoning Committee;

Mr. Wood suggested that the assistance of the Dela. County
Planning Commission be requested on the revision of the Zoning
Ordinance. The Secretary was instructed to communicate with the
Commission to obtain further information as to the costs involved,
as outlined in the Annual Report of the Commission, under the
subject of Local Planning Program.

New Business;

The problem of the Glen Mills escapees was again presented to Council by Mr. Wood. As this is a matter of Public Safety, of interest to the entire community, Mr. Wood suggested some definite action be taken to correct this dangerous condition.

President Breneman therefore dissolved the present Police Committee and appointed a Committee of Public Safety consisting of; Mr. Grahame Wood, Jr., Mr. Clay Krebs and Mr. Jos. Townsend, with the suggestion that this committee ask for the co-operation or services of Mr. John Voigt, Mr. Theo. Buckley, Burgess Schrader, or any others who may assist in the promotion of Public Safety in the Borough.

Tax Collector, Mr. Samuel Jobson presented his report on delinquent taxes for the year 1952.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
