

MINUTES OF THE 75th MEETING OF THE BOROUGH OF CHESTER

Correspondence from the Penna. Highway Dept. and the Dela. County Planning Commission was read and disposed of.

The Treas. report was approved as presented.

Burgess Schrader reported there has been no progress made to fence in the Hollingsworth quarry as promised by the property owner. Upon motion, duly seconded, it was unanimously approved that this matter be presented to the Borough Solicitor for further action.

Chairman Little, of the Highway Committee presented an estimate on re-surfacing Mattson Road. Upon motion, duly seconded, it was approved that the Highway Committee proceed with this work, providing it does not exceed \$300.00.

Upon Motion, which was seconded, it was unanimously

Resolved that the sum of \$ 82.49 be transferred from the unappropriated balance in the General Fund to the Highway Aid Fund in order to comply with the provisions of Act 145.

Mr. John Voigt reported on Civil Defense activities and requested that his resignation as Director be accepted by Council. As Mr. Voigt received his appointment from the Governor of Penna. he was advised that his resignation must be presented to and be accepted by the Governor before Borough Council could recommend another appointee for the post. There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
