

MINUTES OF THE 100th MEETING OF THE BOROUGH OF CHESTER HEIGHTS COUNCIL
HELD IN THE BOROUGH SCHOOL BUILDING MONDAY APRIL 4th 1955 at 8.00 PM

The meeting was called to order by President Breneman with all members present excepting Mr. Kerns and Mr. Stromgren.

The Treasurers Report was approved as presented.

Burgess Little reported the Borough Solicitor had served a 90 day notice to the operators of the Mill at Lenni to cease the discharge of water onto the highway as previously reported. Considerable time was spent on a general discussion of the traffic conditions within the Borough, particularly in the vicinity of the School. Mr. Buckley and Mr. Breneman volunteered to call in person on the Officer in charge of the State Police at Media, present him with the facts and endeavor to formulate a plan whereby the main highway through the Borough would be patrolled more frequently.

Mr. Jos. Townsend, reporting for the Zoning Committee, advised he had received the drafts from the Planning Commission, outlining suggestions for the revision of the Zoning Ordinance.

Mr. Townsend also presented a request from the Zoning Board of Adjustment for a representative of Council to attend meetings of the Board. Mr. Breneman then appointed Mr. Townsend to serve as an ex-Officio member of the Board of Adjustment.

Unfinished business. Mr. Wood suggested that the sum of \$3000.00 of Borough funds be invested in U. S. Treasury Bonds. No action was taken at this time, on this suggestion as it was decided an opinion should be obtained from the Solicitor before Borough Funds are invested or placed in a Savings Account.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
