

MINUTES OF THE 101st MEETING OF THE BOROUGH OF CHESTER HEIGHTS COUNCIL
HELD IN THE BOR. SCHOOL BUILDING MONDAY MAY 2nd 1955 AT 8.00 P. M.

The meeting was called to order by President Breneman, with all members present excepting Mr. Brandt.

The minutes of the April meeting were approved as read.

The Treasurers report was approved and correspondence read.

The next order of business was a discussion on the results of the recent State Police campaign to slow down traffic within the Borough. It is the general opinion that this condition has, at least, temporarily improved. The State Police expect to be furnished with three reports outlining the results of this campaign. These reports will be handled by Mr. Breneman, Mr. Buckley and Mr. Hobaugh.

The question of enforcement of Borough Ordinances was raised by Mr. Hobaugh. It was suggested that the Committee on Public Safety call a special meeting to consider this problem.

Report of Building Inspector. As Mr. Townsend has been seriously ill for some time the Borough has been without the services of a Building Inspector, and it is felt that a successor should be appointed to this office. Several names of persons qualified to fill this office were mentioned, but since these parties should first be interviewed, no action was taken at this time.

Fire Marshall Kerns reported he had investigated the burning of rubbish in the rear of the mill at Lenni and had been promised that this condition would be corrected.

Unfinished Business. Upon the advise of the Borough Solicitor, Mr. Wood reported that surplus Borough funds could be temporarily be invested in U. S. Bonds or Federal Savings and Loan Associations. Upon motion, which was seconded, it was unanimously approved that Mr. Wood be authorized to consult with the Treas. to determine the amount of funds to be invested and where they should be invested.

New Business. Solicitor John Cramp suggested that the Borough subscribe, at a cost of \$42.50 yearly, to the National Institute for Municipal Law Officers. It was moved that this suggestion be tabled at this time, pending further information to be obtained by the Solicitor.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
