The Treasurers report was approved as presented.

Burgess Little reported he had received a complaint of water drainage from the Homestead Dairy and he felt this condition would be corrected. Mr. Little also reported on a complaint he had received in reference to dog kennels. This was referred to the Zoning Committee to consider the enforcement of the Zoning Ordinance covering this specific situation.

The Report of the Committee on Public Safety was presented by Mr. Wood, with the following recommendations; That the present arrangement with the State Police be continued, That a building inspector be appointed who can and will take the necessary time to inspect all new building in the community, and also, in order to aid in the enforcement of the Zoning Ordinance and the Building Code, that all members of Council report any violations which they may observe, to the Burgess.

Committee on Revision of the Zoning Ordinance.

In the absence of Mr. Townsend, the Secretary read a letter in which Mr. Townsend stated he expected to receive by June 17th a re-write of certain sections of the Zoning Ordinance, which was being prepared by the Dela. County Planning Commission. Mr. Townsend suggested a meeting of this committee before the next meeting of Borough Council. It was therefore agreed that this meeting be held on Tuesday July 5th. at 8 P. M.

Unfinished Business; Upon the suggestion of Mr. Wood, it was moved, seconded, and unanimously RESOLVED; that the sum of Three Thousand Dollars of unappropriated Borough Funds be deposited with the Wayne Federal Savings and Loan Association.

New Business; A discussion on fire protection in the Borough was opened and the financial condition of the Fire Company was presented by Mr. Hobough. Due to the fact that the Annual Horse Show, which has been the main source of revenue for the Fire Company for the past several years, could not be held this year, other means of raising the necessary funds must be found in order to complete the fire house, pay off the mortgage of \$2000.00 and keep the equipment in operation. It was then moved, seconded and unanimously approved that the sum of Two-thousand & two Hundred Dollars (\$2200.00) of unappropriated Borough Funds be paid to the Chester Heights Fire Company, upon receipt of a financial statement of the Company, for the purpose of clearing the mortgage on the Fire House.

Upon motion, which was duly seconded, it was unanimously approved that the preceding Resolution to deposit Three thousand Dollars with the Wayne Federal Saving & Loan Association, is hereby repealed.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
