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Ordinance No 5 -1946 Amending Ordinance No.3-1946 came up for discussion and it was unanimously

53 RESOLVED, that

ORDINANCE NO.5 - 1946

An Ordinance Amending Section 801 of Ordinance No.3 - 1946 entitled, "An Ordinance Providing For Fire Prevention And Protection In Connection With Hazardous Materials And Processes," and Adding to Said Ordinance An Additional Section Known As Section 805.

The Council of the Borough of Chester Heights doth ordain:

(1) That Section 801 of Ordinance No.3 - 1946 entitled, "An Ordinance Providing For Fire Prevention And Protection In Connection With Hazardous Materials and Processes," be and is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Any person, persons, or corporations who shall violate any provision of this ordinance or fail to comply therewith, or who shall violate or fail to comply with any order or regulation made thereunder, or who shall build in violation of a detailed statement or plan submitted and approved thereunder, or of a permit issued thereunder, shall pay upon conviction in summary proceedings before any justice of the peace of Delaware County a fine of not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$100.00, and in default thereof shall be committed to the County Prison for a period of not less than five days nor more than thirty days for each day such violation continues. It being the intent of this section that each day such violation is permitted to exist or continue shall constitute a separate offense.

"The application of the above penalty shall not be held to prevent the enforced removal of prohibited conditions."

(2) That Ordinance No.3 - 1946 entitled, "An Ordinance Providing For Fire Prevention And Protection In Connection With Hazardous Materials and Processes," be and is hereby amended by adding thereto an additional Section as follows:

"Section 805. Any permit required under this Ordinance to be secured from the Chief of the Fire Department may be secured by paying to the Chief of the Fire Department the sum of \$1.00 for each permit applied for."

This Resolution was passed unanimously.

The need of transferring \$22.00 from the Budget allowance of \$112.50 under heading of Miscellaneous-Insurance, to General Government funds for Premium on Official Bonds thereby increasing the latter fund to \$97.00 came up before Council who-

54 RESOLVED, the above Budget item be changed accordingly, thereby providing sufficient funds in the General Government "Funds for Premiums on Official Bonds" to meet premium demands and cancel out this Budget allowance.

A question was raised by Borough Solicitor Mr. Donald Hamilton regarding the Insurance coverage of Officers and Employees of the Borough while operating motor vehicles, not owned by the Borough but being used on Borough business. Mr. Buckley, the Insurance Agent for the General Accident Ins. Co. stated this situation was fully covered by the Policy but at the request of Council Mr. Buckley will get a letter from the Insurance Co. to this effect and present it at the June meeting.

An Anti Dumping Ordinance as proposed by our Solicitor was discussed and it was

55 RESOLVED that,

ORDINANCE NO.6 - 1946

An Ordinance Prohibiting The Establishment of Dumps In The Borough of Chester Heights For The Dumping of Ashes, Rubbish, Garbage, Machinery, Junk, Or Any Refuse Whatsoever, Or The Maintenance Of Automobile Dumps Or Graveyards, And Providing For Permits In Connection With The Same.

The Council of The Borough Of Chester Heights doth ordain:

(1) That it shall be unlawful for any person, persons, or corporations to dump ashes, rubbish, garbage, papers, machinery, junk, or any refuse or waste matter whatsoever within the limits

of the Borough of Chester Heights without first having obtained a permit from Borough Council for dumping on locations approved by Borough Council.

(2) That it shall be a violation of this Ordinance for any property owner to permit the dumping of any ashes, rubbish, garbage, papers, machinery, junk, or any refuse or waste matter whatsoever upon his ground in violation of the terms of this Ordinance without first having obtained a permit from Borough Council for dumping on his premises.

(3) That it shall be unlawful for any person, persons, or corporation to set up, established or maintain an automobile dump or graveyard where old automobiles, or parts thereof, are kept and stored either for business or for other purposes.

(4) That any person, persons, or corporations violating this Ordinance, or any of the provisions thereof, shall pay, upon conviction in summary proceedings before any justice of the peace of Delaware County, a fine of not less than Five (\$5.00) Dollars nor more than Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars, and in default thereof shall be committed to the County Prison for not less than ten days nor more than thirty days, and each day this Ordinance is violated shall constitute a separate and additional offense.

ORDINANCE NO. 4 - 1946

An Ordinance Amending Sections 5 and 45 of Ordinance No. 2 1946, being "An Ordinance Providing For Fire Limits, And The Construction And Equipment of Buildings."

The Council of The Borough Of Chester Heights doth ordain:

(1) That Section 5 of Ordinance No. 2 - 1946 of the Borough entitled, "An Ordinance Providing For Fire Limits, And The Construction And Equipment of Buildings," be amended so as to add to said Section the following paragraph:

"'House trailer' means any vehicle for living or sleeping purposes. If a house trailer is used for living or sleeping purposes within the Borough for an aggregate of more than thirty days in any period of one year, it shall be considered a single family dwelling for all purposes of this ordinance."

(2) That Section 45 of Ordinance No. 2 - 1946 of the Borough entitled, "An Ordinance Providing For Fire Limits, And The Construction And Equipment of Buildings," be amended so as to read as follows:

"Any person, persons, or corporations who shall violate any provisions of this ordinance or fail to comply therewith or with any other requirements thereof, or who shall erect, construct, alter or repair, or has erected, constructed, altered or repaired any building or structure, in violation of a detailed statement or plan submitted and approved thereunder, or of a permit or certificate issued thereunder, shall pay upon conviction in summary proceedings before any justice of the peace of Delaware County a fine of not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$50.00, and in default thereof shall be committed to the County Prison for a period of not less than five days nor more than thirty days for each

day such violation of this ordinance shall continue. It being the intent of this section that each day such violation is permitted to exist or continue shall constitute a separate offense."
