

MINUTES OF THE 110th MEETING OF THE BORO. OF CHESTER HEIGHTS COUNCIL
HELD IN THE BORO. SCHOOL BUILDING MONDAY FEB. 6th 1956 AT 8.00 P. M.

The meeting was called to order by President Wood, with all members present excepting Mr. Stromgren and Mr. Voigt.

The minutes of the January meeting were approved.

The Treasurers report was approved as presented.

Burgess Report; Mr. Little stated he had nothing to report at this time.

Zoning Committee report; Mr. Townsend reported that the proposed ammendments to the Zoning Ordinance were now completed and that a public hearing should be called for consideration of these proposed ammendments.

Unfinished business; It was moved, seconded and unanimously RESOLVED, that a public hearing shall be held in the Boro. School Building on Monday March 12th 1956 at 8.00 P. M., at which time the Borough Council will consider proposed ammendments to the Chester Heights Borough Zoning Ordinance of 1946 as amended, and that notice of this public hearing shall be published in the Chester Times and the Rockdale Herald once a week for three successive weeks.

It is noted with regret that our Building Inspector, Mr. James T. Townsend, has passed away. The Secretary was directed to write to Mrs. Townsend, expressing the sympathy and gratitude of the

members of Council for the faithful services rendered to the Borough by Mr. Townsend.

Upon motion, which was duly seconded, the Secretary was directed to write to Mr. Newton Townsend, inquiring as to his willingness or desire to serve as Building Inspector. In the event that he should not care to fill this position, President Wood appointed a committee composed of Mr. Hobough and Mr. Brandt to consider a candidate to fill the vacancy.

A communication from Mr. Richard D. Wood, Jr., in reference to the disposal system of St. Thomas' School was read and referred to the Committee for Public Safety.

New Business; The next order of business was the consideration of the Budget for the year 1956. Mr. Hobough presented the Budget as prepared by the Financial Committee. It was then moved and seconded and unanimously RESOLVED that the Budget for the year 1956 is hereby adopted.

The next order of business was the fixing of the Tax Rate.

Upon motion, which was duly seconded, it was unanimously RESOLVED, that Tax Ordinance #29 fixing the tax rate in the sum of THREE (3) mills on each dollar of assessed valuation for general Borough purposes is hereby adopted.

At this time, Mr. Geo. Anderson and Mr. Benj. Levin requested permission to address Council. These gentlemen stated they were present as a result of a letter they has received from the Sect'y. regarding the establishment of a riding academy on the Walnut Hill farm property. Mr. Anderson, ^{who} has leased the property from Mr. Levin, and is the operator of the riding academy, stated this enterprise would be conducted in a proper manner and in accordance to the provisions of all Borough Ordinances.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
