

MINUTES OF THE 117th. MEETING OF THE BORO. OF CHESTER HEIGHTS' COUNCIL
HELD IN THE BORO. SCHOOL BUILDING MONDAY SEPT. 10th 1956 AT 8.00 P. M.

The meeting was called to order by President Wood, with all members present excepting Mr. Brandt.

The Minutes of the August meeting were read and approved.

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The Treasurers Report as presented by Miss Dickson was approved.

Burgess Little reported that another Riding Academy was being operated on the former Walnut Hill Farms property but could not furnish the name of the operator. Since the former operator had applied to the Board of Adjustment for a special exception the Secretary was directed to obtain a report from the Board of Adjustment on this matter.

Building Inspector Mr. Urban reported that the Roberts Const. Co. had withdrawn from their contract to erect a central office for the Bell Telephone Co. and building Permit #139 had been cancelled and the fee refunded. Building Permit #145 was then issued to the A. Raymond Raff Co. to proceed with this project.

Mr. Urban also presented the request of Mr. Schivert, of Lenni Rd., to have the Phila. Electric. Co. pole in front of this property moved approximately 12 feet to enable Mr. Schivert to install a driveway into his property. This matter was referred to Mr. Voigt for investigation and the Secretary was directed to contact the Phila. Electric Co.

At this time Miss Lillian Souder, of Lenni Rd. requested permission

to address Council. Miss Souder registered a complaint against the Crystal-X Corp. for the offensive odors and smoke created by the uncontrolled burning of rubbish and the noise of a well drilling machine which a neighbor was operating at night.

Mr. Wood referred these complaints to a committee composed of Mr. Hobough and Mr. Voigt for investigation and the Secretary was directed to write to the Crystal-X Corp. to eliminate the nuisance caused by the burning of rubbish.

New business; A communication from the Dela. County Director of Civil Defense requesting the appointment of a Director for the Borough was deferred until the October meeting.

The resignation of Mr. Arthur ^{Brandt} as a member of Council was read and accepted. The Secretary was directed to write a letter of thanks to Mr. Brandt for the services he has rendered to the Borough.

President Wood called for nominations for the appointment of a Councilman to serve the unexpired term of Mr. Brandt. The names of Mr. Chester Anderson and Mr. Herbert Breneman were placed in nomination and nominations then declared closed. Ballots were then cast by the members of Council with the result that Mr. Breneman received the majority vote and was declared a member of Council, to serve until the first Monday of January 1960. Mr. Stromgren inquired as to the advisability of placing "No Dumping of Rubbish" signs on the Borough Highways. This was referred to the Highway Committee for consideration.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
