

MINUTES OF THE 151st MEETING OF THE COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF CHESTER HEIGHTS HELD IN THE CHESTER HEIGHTS FIREHOUSE MONDAY AUG. 3rd 1959 at 8.00PM

The treasurers report was presented by Miss Dickson and approved.

Burgess Report;

Mr. Breneman reported on Police activities for the month of July, Officer Lewis Baker was on duty for 23 hours and covered a total of 156 miles for the month. His salary and milage totaling \$61.60 to be paid at the end of the year.

Mr. Breneman advised that he had received an inquiry from the State Police regarding a local Firearms Ordinance. As the Borough does not have such an ordinance Mr. Breneman suggested that an ordinance prohibiting the discharge of high-powered rifles in conformity with the State Game Laws be adopted.

It has been reported that a Liquor License has been issued to O'Connell Bros. Service Station. Since no official notice on this License has been received by Borough Officials, Mr. Breneman advised that he would investigate this with the Liquor Control Board.

Highway Committee Report;

Mr. Hobough advised that a few new highway signs would be purchased and installed where needed and the Committee was also considering

repairs to Matson Road.

There were no further Committee reports presented.

At this time Mr. Townsend presented Ordinance #39 re-classifying the Kerns property from R-2 District to B- Business District.

It was moved and seconded and unanimously RESOLVED that Ordinance #39 as presented is hereby adopted.
