

MINUTES OF THE 162nd MEETING OF THE COUNCIL OF THE BORO. OF CHESTER HEIGHTS HELD IN THE BORO. FIREHOUSE MONDAY JULY 11th 1960 at 8.00 P. M.

This meeting was called to order by President Townsend, with all members present excepting Mr. Smitheman and Mr. Wood.

The minutes of the June meeting were read and approved.

The Treasurer's report was presented by Miss Dickson and approved.

Burgess report; Mr. Breneman rendered his report on the enforcement of parking regulations during the past month.

Highway Committee; Mr. Hobaugh inquired as to the status of the roadway to the McManus property, which Mr. McManus agreed to dedicate to the Borough upon the completion of three houses.

The Secretary was directed to contact Mr. McManus regarding this matter.

Public Safety Committee suggested that the use of all hunting rifles be prohibited within the Borough. This committee was requested to draft the necessary Ordinance.

The re-classification of the Groff property from residential to business was again discussed. Mr. Townsend agreed to talk to the Boro. Solicitor regarding this matter.

New business; Mr. Ward presented the revised Building and Plumbing Code. It was then moved and seconded and unanimously approved that

Ordinance #42, known as the "Building and Sanitation Code of the Borough Of Chester Heights, is hereby adopted.

It was also moved and seconded and unanimously agreed that a charge of Three Dollars (\$3.00) be made for a printed copy of this Ordinance.

Upon motion, which was seconded, Mr. Pierce Crompton was unanimously re-appointed as a member of the Borough Planning Commission for the term of Five years commencing June 1st 1960.

There being no further business, the meeting then adjourned.
