

MINUTES OF THE 182nd MEETING OF THE COUNCIL OF THE BORO. OF CHESTER HEIGHTS HELD IN THE BORO. FIREHALL MONDAY MARCH 5th 1962 at 8.00 P. M.

In accordance with the request of the Delaware County Chamber of Commerce, it was moved and seconded and unanimously RESOLVED, That the Delaware County Chamber of Commerce be designated as the County's Tourist Promotion Agency for the purpose of applying for a grant from the State Department of Commerce, to be matched by a grant from the County Chamber of Commerce, to promote tourism in the County in accordance
