Unfinished business; Further discussion was held on the designation

of Wawa Road thru the Old Ivy development. The Secretary was directed,

in cooperation with Mr. Kerns, of the Highway Committee, to write to

the Supervisors of Concord Township, requesting their consideration

on the designation of Wawa Road thru the Concord section of this

development from the Chester Heights boundary to Baltimore Pike.

New business; Resolution, prepared by the Penna. Dept. of Highways,

establishing a speed limit of 40 miles per hour on Llewellyn Road

between Lenni Road and Valleybrook Road was unanimously adopted.

In cooperation with the Delaware County Planning Commission and the County of Delaware it was unanimously Resolved that the Borough of Chester Heights joins the eight municipalities in the Chester Creek Drainage Basin in seeking the help of the United States Corps of Engineers to conduct a Flood Plain Information Study of the Creek Valley.

President Hobough appointed a committee consisting of Mr. Kelly, Mr. Farr and Mr. Ward to recommend a candidate for the vacancy on the Borough Planning Commission, which will occur on May 31st.

There being no further business, the meeting then adjourned.
