HIGHWAY COMMITTEE: Mr. Kerns advised that the roadways of the "Old Ivy" development have been completed in accordance with the agreement with the Hedgewood, Inc. and the papers of dedication have been prepared.

It was moved and seconded and unanimously "RESOLVED, that in accordance with the Sub-division Agreement between the Borough of Chester Heights and Hedgewood Inc., dated 8/26/59, whereby all street improvements having been completed to the satisfaction of Borough Council the Council hereby agrees to accept dedication of the roadways in this development and the President of Borough Council is so authorized to sign the Deed of Dedication for the Borough of Chester Heights.

BORO. NAME COMMITTEE: Mr. Gardner advised that he proposes to send a questionnaire to all citizens of the Borough. Approval was granted for the expenditure of \$50.00 for this purpose.
