

MINUTES OF THE 224th MEETING OF THE COUNCIL OF THE BORO. OF CHESTER HEIGHTS
HELD IN THE BORO. FIREHOUSE TUESDAY SEPT. 7th 1965 at 8.00 P. M.

Mayor Breneman administered the Oath of Office to Mr. Raymond Shisler as a member of this Council. The meeting was then called to order by Vice-President Ward, with all other members, excepting Mr. Kelly, present. The Minutes of the August meeting were read and approved.

The Highway Committee advised that the Boro. Engineer was preparing a survey and estimate on the walkway along Valleybrook Rd. to St. Thomasⁿ School.

Unfinished business; Mr. Gardner advised that a meeting between members of Council and members of the School Board was held and that any misunderstandings were adjusted and that the Deed to the School Building has been prepared without any restrictions.

It was then moved and seconded and unanimously approved, that the Council of the Boro. of Chester Heights will accept the Deed to the School Building, without restrictions, when it is presented.

Mr. Ward appointed the following as members of a temporary School Bldg. Comm.

Mr. Gardner, Mr. Moyman and Mr. Smitheman.

Mrs. Shisler was appointed a member of the Highway Committee.

Mr. Smitheman proposed that Boro. Council take an active part in the campaign to repeal the School merger Act #299. Mr. Ward appointed a committee of Mr. Smitheman, Mr. Moyman and Mr. Shisler to prepare letters to be sent to members of the State Legislature urging repeal

of this Act. Copies of this letter also to be distributed to the citizens of the Borough.
