# Statement:

**On March 6**<sup>th</sup>, **2020**, Governor Tom Wolf signed an Emergency Disaster Declaration to provide increased support to state agencies involved in the response to the COVID-19 virus.

On March 16<sup>th</sup>, 2020, Mayor Wood proclaimed a Disaster Emergency due to the COVID-19 pandemic. According to the Borough Code, the Proclamation included closure of the Borough Office to the public and appointing Larry Ward as the Emergency Management Coordinator.

On March 19<sup>th</sup>, 2020, Governor Tom Wolf issued an Executive Order

shutting down physical locations of all non-life sustaining businesses due to the COVID-19 virus pandemic.

On March 21<sup>st</sup>, 2020, Council by Resolution #3-20-A, extended the Mayor's Proclamation of Disaster Emergency until the Commonwealth Disaster Declaration to Delaware County and Municipalities ends. On March 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2020, the Governor issued his first Order to Stay at Home which effected the Philadelphia Area including Delaware County. The Stay at Home Order is now effective through April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2020.

Because the Borough is operating under a State and Borough Declaration of Disaster Emergency, Council is conducting this special Council meeting remotely to protect the public and limit personal contact. To that end, the Borough published a legal notice on April 4<sup>th</sup>, 2020 in the Daily Times advertising this special meeting using ZOOM consistent with the

State Sunshine Act. Due to the meeting being held remotely all documents to be voted on and discussed during the Council meeting will be posted on the Borough's website after the meeting. Also, no committee reports will be discussed unless requested by the committee Chair.

# Storm-water Controls and Best Management Practices Operations and Maintenance Agreement – 15 Stoney Bank Road-Chester Heights Storage

Mike Ciocco P.E.,S.E.O., required new owner to open a Storm-water and Best Management Practices Agreement with the Borough. *Solicitor Montella presented* the Agreement to Council requiring \$4,227.30 to be escrowed. The Agreement provides for management of storm-water within the confines of the property through the use of Best Management Practices (BMP's), for the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the Municipality and the protection and maintenance of the water quality which require on-site storm-water BMP constructed and maintained on the property.

#### MOTION

Upon Motion, Council (Clarke/Lim) voted and approved the Storm-water Controls and Best Management Practices Operation and Maintenance Agreement for 15 Stoney Bank Road – Chester Heights Storage Facility.

President Baum and Council took a moment to thank Gerald C. Montella, Esq. Solicitor, for his hard work over the last two weeks of bringing the Open Space purchase to closing. Solicitor Montella, also wanted to thank Sue Timmins and Matt Houtmann for their assistance.

<u>Engineer's Reports:</u> Engineer Houtmann presented Arbour Square/Westrum Development final escrow release #4 in the amount of \$88,964.00 less any open invoices owed to the Borough and contingent on items being satisfied per Engineer Houtmann's review.

#### MOTION

Upon Motion, Council (Clarke/Lim) voted and approved to the final release of Arbour Square/Westrum Development's Escrow #4 in the amount of \$88,964.00 less any outstanding invoices owed to the Borough and professional consultants and contingent on open items being satisfied per Engineer Houtmann's review.

Engineer Houtmann presented a 90 Day extension for S.B. Conrad - 31 Smithbridge Road Land Development, which would end July 13, 2020.

Engineer Houtmann announced the assessment of the Borough's road's condition has been completed and a report with estimated costs was submitted to Council by email and that all roads seemed to be in descent condition. The roads that would need attention at the earliest would be Ivy Lane & Mattson Road.

Engineer Houtmann requested an authorization to approve a Resolution for the routine application for Delaware County Liquid Fuel Funds for 2020 in the amount of \$743.00.

Engineer Houtmann responded to Councilman Firkser concerns from auditor conflict concerning the advanced vehicle detection traffic signal upgrades. Engineer Houtmann and Secretary Timmins are communicating with auditor to clear up any matters.

<u>Mayor's Report:</u> Mayor Wood presented a proposal from Scott's Lawn Service to install two park benches in the amount of \$354.00, not to exceed \$400.00.

School District/Education/Training/Library- Mr. Greg Chestnut reported the Library offers 25,000 ebooks/audio books online and the public can acquire a library card by calling the office so they can access those amenities.

He also announced the library was going to apply for a small business administration loan under the payroll protection plan program to keep staff on payroll for the next 8 weeks.

Ms. Mary Kay Beirne talked about the school district being closed and how students were working online with a program called Schoology. And also thanked Larry Ward with getting the program ready and running.

responded the sign recommended by PennDOT's Chief Engineer. Solictor Montella suggested it would be prudent to follow PennDOT's Chief Engineer's recommendation and keep the sign in place.

Public Safety/Environmental- No Report

Public Utilities/Trash/Recycle- Councilwoman Lim announced a tentative date for Recycling Day to be held on September 26<sup>th</sup>, 2020 and encourages residents to clean up and clear out clutter in preparation.

Borough Property/Parks/Open Space- Councilwoman Lim announced PABeautiful.org from May 1<sup>st</sup> – 31<sup>st</sup>, 2020. Encouraging Borough's to clean up parks. PennDOT and DEP is sponsoring PA Great American Clean Up and the Chester Heights Borough's Community Park is having a clean up on May 9<sup>th</sup>, 2020, a low number of 10 volunteers are being requested due to COVID-19. Dates to possibly change if necessary.

Councilwoman Lim requested Council to approve soil testing at the Chester Heights Community Park from three different locations within park (playground soil, soccer field, and grassy area between the parking lot and soccer field). The soil will be tested for lead, nitrate nitrogen, and ammonium nitrate per Scott from Scott's Landscaping. The amount to be approved for testing is \$126.00.

**MOTION** 

Upon Motion, Council (Baum/Anderson) voted and approved to spend \$126.00 on soil testing at the Chester Heights Community Park, from three different locations within the park, for lead, nitrate nitrogen, and ammonium nitrate.

Councilwoman Lim presented to Council safety concerns and park maintenance upkeep at the Chester Heights Community Park. Councilwoman Lim and Mayor Wood walked the Community Park with Keith Laulis from Springfield Tree and Land Service. Upon their inspection notable trees, limbs and debris showed safety concerns. Springfield Tree and Land Service, Keith Laulis, gave an estimate of \$4365.00 to remove all tree limb issues and debris, including removal of 2 Ornamental Pear trees, and a Cherry tree.

**MOTION** 

Upon Motion, Council (Ellis/Firsker) voted and approved Springfield Tree and Land Service to remove all tree/limb issues and debris for the cost of \$4365.00 with the condition that the Borough is named as additional insured on the certificate of insurance policy.

Councilwoman Lim advised that during the inspection, they noticed an above ground retention basin approx. 40' from soccer field.

*Engineer Houtmann* is going to look into the issue and find out who's property it is and will let Council know what he finds as soon as possible.
