Resolution #03-22-A

Resolution of Act 537 Plan Update:

Whereas, Section 5 of the Act of January 24, 1996, P.L. 1535, No. 537, known as the "Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act", as amended, and the Rules and Regulations of the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) adopted thereunder, Chapter 71 of Title 25 of the Pennsylvania Code, requires the municipality to adopt an Official Sewage Facilities Plan providing for sewage services adequate to prevent contamination of water and/or environmental health hazards with sewage wastes, and to revise said Plan whenever it is necessary to meet the sewage disposal needs of the municipality, and Whereas, Gannett Fleming, Inc. has prepared an Act 537 Update for the entire DELCORA Service Area. This plan is for the sole purpose of addressing the PA DEP Act 537 requirements for the Eastern Service Area Plan Update.

Whereas the alternative of choice to be implemented is Alternative 2 – Construction of the Deep Tunnel storage and conveyance facility and upgrades to the Pumping and Treatment Facilities.

Whereas, Council for the Borough of Chester Heights, finds that the Act 537 Plan Update described above conforms to applicable zoning and subdivision ordinances and to other municipal ordinances and plans, and to a comprehensive program of pollution control and water quality management.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved that the Council for the Borough of Chester Heights, Delaware County hereby adopt and submit to the Department of Environmental Protection for its approval as an update of the "Official Plan" of the Borough of Chester Heights the above referenced Act 537 Plan Update. The Borough hereby assures the Department of the complete and timely implementation of the said plan as required by law. (Section 5, Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act as amended.)

Resolution #03-22-C: to be used for the Borough of Chester Heights Community Park Walking Trail Be It Further Resolved, that the Applicant does hereby designate Drew J. Baum, President and Susan Timmins, Borough Secretary as the official(S) to execute all documents and agreements between the Council for the Borough of Chester Heights and the Commonwealth Financing Authority to facilitate and assist in obtaining the requested grant.

Resolution#03-22-D

Solicitor Montella presented Resolution #03-22-D:

A resolution of the Borough of Chester Heights, Delaware County, allowing for exemption of payment of Borough Real Estate Taxes the including Fire Service Appropriations Tax for a disabled veteran who is resident of the Borough and who has applied for and has been approved for an exemption by the Pennsylvania State Veterans' Commission.

Whereas, any resident of this Commonwealth may be exempt from payment of all real estate taxes levied upon any building or land occupied by a person as a principal dwelling; and

Whereas, the exemption exists under the Commonwealth statues Chapter 89, Section 8901, et, seq. for veterans who have been honorably discharges or released under honorable circumstances, who are totally disabled and permanently disabled because of service-connected causes incurred during a period of war or armed conflict and who demonstrate a financial need; and

Whereas, the need for the exemption from the payment of real estate taxes has been determined by the State Veterans Committee and compliance with the requirements of Chapter 89, Section 9001, et, seq.; and

Whereas, veterans who reside in the borough and who have applied for and met the qualifications of the statutory exemption and provided proof thereof are exempt from payment of borough real estate taxes including fire service appropriations tax
