

MINUTES OF THE 280TH COUNCIL MEETING OF THE BOROUGH OF CHESTER HEIGHTS HELD IN THE  
BOROUGH FIREHOUSE, MONDAY, MAY 4, 1970

The meeting was called to order with all members present; the minutes of April's meeting were read and approved, all correspondence was handled and the following receipts were reported:

The treasurer's report was read by Mrs. Tucker and approved.

Highway Committee: The access ways across the bridge have been paved by the State Highway Department and "No Parking" signs can now be posted.

Building Inspector: The Building Inspector attended a meeting re changes in the Sewage Facilities Act. On-lot sewage permits are now required for all lots with the exception of lots of 10 acres or more.

Planning Commission: There will be a meeting Tuesday, May 5 with Council representatives on Comprehensive Borough Planning.

Building Committee: No rent has been received so far from the present Borough building tenant; John Moymann was directed to contact Theo. O. Buckley Agency to include liability insurance in the Borough Building fire insurance policy. (This liability insurance is approximately \$25.00 per year) and the Secretary was directed to send a registered letter to Mr. & Mrs. Finley re the abandoned car that still remains on the Borough Building property.

New Business: A discussion was held on various Borough signs that have been stored on the fire company's property. It was suggested that a 8 x 10 structure be purchased by the Borough to house these signs. The fire company will pour the concrete for the foundation and erect the building. A motion was then made, seconded and approved to purchase a metal storage shed not to exceed \$150.00 to house these signs. In addition, the Secretary was directed to write to Chester Heights Fire Company President John Moymann requesting formal approval from the fire company to have this building placed on their property.

The meeting then adjourned.
